About the BridgeAI Project

BridgeAI is a forward-thinking Erasmus+ project dedicated to empowering students aged 10–14, particularly newcomer, immigrant, and marginalized youth, by enhancing their understanding of Artificial Intelligence (AI) and promoting their active participation in society. The project aims to bridge educational gaps by integrating AI concepts into the classroom, fostering social inclusion, and preparing young learners to become responsible digital citizens. The primary objectives of the BridgeAI project are to develop an educational package designed to support newcomer students in adapting to society through the use of AI and to improve educators' understanding of AI's role in social development. Additionally, the project seeks to empower students to influence community norms and practices through AI education while addressing the technological, ethical, and legal challenges that accompany AI advancements.

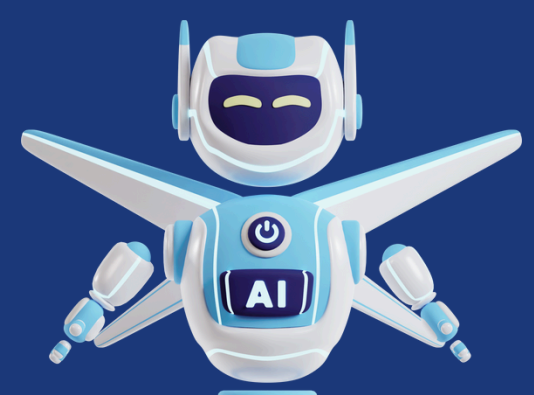

The BridgeAI project is structured to ensure effective project execution and impactful results. First result is the **Development of the BridgeAI Film** involves creating an educational AI-themed film aimed at engaging students and supporting the learning process through visual storytelling. Second result is **Forming a Syllabus for AI Education Focused on Social Inclusion and Civic Participation** which is dedicated to developing a comprehensive syllabus that integrates AI education with themes of social inclusion and active citizenship. Last result of the project will be **Creating a Comprehensive Proposal for Policy Reform and Action Plan** that aims to influence educational policy by delivering strategic recommendations and action plans for incorporating AI education in schools.



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Transnational Project Meeting in Trollhättan, Sweden

From November 25 to 27, 2024, the BridgeAI project consortium convened in Trollhättan, Sweden, for a significant Transnational Project Meeting.
