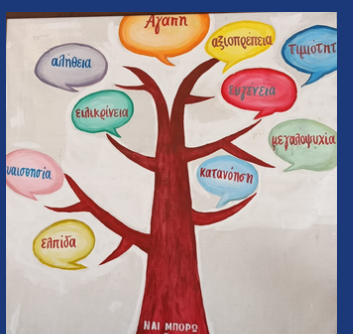


Partners Gather in Kamena Vourla to Celebrate Achievements and Shape the Future of Inclusive AI Education
